(20 hrs per pay period)**FUNCTIONAL STATEMENT:** Nurse Practitioner**TYPE OF APPOINTMENT:** Temporary, Not to exceed 1 year.**SALARY RANGE:** Nurse II: \$56,480 to \$75,114; Nurse III: \$61,562 to \$81,868 per annum. Salary is dependant upon qualifications and experience. (Salary listed is for full-time employment)**NOTE 1:** First consideration will be given to those who respond by 6/1/04.**NOTE 2:** This agency provides reasonable accommodations to applicants with disabilities. The work conditions may require some rotation in the tour of duty.**LOCATION:** This position is located in the Opiate treatment Program, Mental Health Division, Portland OR Division. It may be necessary to utilize the selected person's services at a different Medical Center location if conditions require it in the future.**AREA OF CONSIDERATION:** Consideration will go to any qualified U.S. Citizen**DUTIES:** The complete Functional Statement may be reviewed Human Resources Management Division. The following duties and responsibilities are taken from the functional statement and are considered to be a brief extract. The Nurse Practitioner (NP) functions with delineated clinical privileges granted by the Medical Staff. The NP in is a member of an interdisciplinary team providing primary care for patients and/or employees. This includes the following: assessment of risk factors; performing histories and physicals; ordering diagnostic and therapeutic tests/studies; initiating consults and referrals; prescribing medications/supplies in accordance with VA policy, VA formulary, and State regulations; seeks consultation with physicians whenever cases are outside of scope of practice; communicates relevant patient data in case presentations and medical records; formulates, initiates, and evaluates health care teaching related to patients and families; facilitates communication related to patients with personnel responsible for their hospital and clinic services; and acts as a consultant to nursing and medical staff.**Qualifications:**

- A. Citizen of United States
- B. Graduate of a school of professional nursing approved by the appropriate State agency and accredited by one of the following accrediting bodies at the time the program was completed by the applicant: The National League for Nursing Accrediting Commission (NLNAC) or The Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE).
- C. In cases of graduates of foreign schools of professional nursing, possession of current, full, active, and unrestricted registration and the possession of a Certificate from the Commission on Graduates of Foreign Nursing Schools (CGFNS) will meet the requirement of graduation from an approved school of professional nursing.
- D. Current, full, active and unrestricted registration as a graduate professional nurse in a State, Territory, or Commonwealth (i.e., Puerto Rico) of the U.S. or in the District of Columbia. The RN must maintain a current, full active and unrestricted registration to continue employment with the VA.
- E. RN's appointed to direct patient care positions must be proficient in spoken and written English as required by 38USC 7402(d) and 7407(d).
- F. A nurse practitioner must be licensed or otherwise recognized as a nurse practitioner in a State, and maintain full and current certification as a nurse practitioner from the American Nurses Association or another nationally recognized certifying body. Nurse Practitioners must be licensed with prescriptive privileges by the Oregon State Board of Nursing.

- F. SF-50, Notification of Personnel Action" (for proof of civilian Federal status). (if applicable)
